ITINERARY

THU 21 SEP 2017 AUSTRALIA/ SANTIAGO/ LIMA

Board your flight to South America; crossing the International Date Line you will arrive the same day in Lima after a transit in Santiago. You will be met at the airport by our English speaking local guide and transferred to your hotel. Evening at leisure. *Four Points by Sheraton: 1 night classic rooms with buffet breakfast*

FRI 22 SEP 2017 LIMA/ CUZCO/ SACRED VALLEY OF THE INCAS (B)

Transfer to the airport this morning for the short flight to Cuzco. On arrival in Cuzco you will be met by our local guide and transferred to your hotel in the Sacred Valley.

Along the way we'll visit Awanacancha, which is a weaving centre with the goal to keep alive the traditional textile arts. You can also learn about the harvesting of the different wools and the natural dying techniques and have a chance to see native weavers from different areas showing their different weaving styles and dress. Here you can see four members of the camelid family - llama, alpacas, vicunas and guanacos.

A short journey through the Sacred Valley will bring you to your ideally located hotel. You have the afternoon at your own leisure to enjoy the beautiful setting of the Sacred Valley and acclimatise to the altitude. *Posada del Inca Yucay: 3 night in standard rooms with buffet breakfast*

SAT 23 SEP 2017 SACRED VALLEY (B)

Morning at leisure. Later this afternoon we'll depart for the ancient city of Ollantaytambo with a visit to Seminario's ceramics workshop en route.

Pablo Seminario and Marilú Behar developed their style in Urubamba, a town in the heart of the Sacred Valley of the Incas. The unique location fosters continual growth and a more widespread recognition of this pair's artwork. On arrival we'll watch a video and then stroll through the various parts of the workshop with a guide to come to an understanding of the distinct processes that each piece from Seminario Ceramics passes through. Usually, you can find Pablo Seminario and Marilú Behar creating more art in their workshops.

The workshop visit is a complete experience for visitors, as they will see all the different environments that the utilitarian, decorative, and artistic objects that are displayed in the Gallery come from.

We then continue to the town of Ollantaytambo, "the unique living Inca town": the best surviving example of Inca city planning, with narrow cobblestone streets that have been continuously inhabited since the 13th century. Your tour will finish with lunch before returning to your hotel with a chance to relax in the afternoon





SUN 24 SEP 2017 SACRED VALLEY (B/L)

Today's tour will take you to some of the loveliest sites in the Sacred Valley of the Incas. We begin with a visit to Maras where you will see the famous salt terraces, in use since Incan times.

Afterwards we drive to Moray, famous for its embedded amphitheatre formed by four circular terraces which seem to disappear into the interior of the puna like an artificial crater. Evidence seems to suggest that Moray was an important centre of Inca agriculture research on crops grown on different sized plots and at various altitudes. The irrigated fertile soil was experimented with more than 250 different types of vegetables, cereals like corn, quinoa and kiwicha.

The last stop of the day is at Chinchero, a quaint little town that houses an important Incan outpost, built at the end of the 1400's, as well as a small but lovely and very traditional church. The townsfolk are famous for having preserved traditional Andean spinning and weaving techniques, and they set up a market in the town square to sell handmade crafts made around the region to visitors.



Note: This evening, pack an overnight bag for your stay at Machu Picchu, your main luggage will be transferred back to Cuzco and placed in secure storage and will be made available to you when you check in to the hotel. ***You must carry your passport with you.*** When packing your bag please bear in mind the below luggage requirements for Peru Rail passengers travelling to Machu Picchu: Each Passenger is allowed to carry only light baggage on board the train, with a maximum weight of 5 kg and measuring 157cm (length + height + width) due to limited space.

MON 25 SEP 2017 SACRED VALLEY/ MACHU PICCHU (B/L/D)

Machu Picchu is probably South America's most iconic site and with good reason; today is sure to be a highlight of your trip!

Transfer to the train station in Ollantaytambo this morning for the Vistadome Train to Aguas Calientes; a 90 minute journey. The Vistadome is the ideal train for those who want to be in contact with the environment and appreciate the wonderful journey to Machu Picchu. Surrounded entirely by glass and wagons with large panoramic windows offering incomparable scenic views and numerous opportunities

to capture amazing pictures, Vistadome travellers feel connected and part of the impressive landscape of Peru. Perurail provide travellers on board personalized and first level service to give them an unforgettable life experience.

Upon your arrival into Aguas Calientes Railway Station, you will be met by your English speaking guide who will arrange for your luggage to be taken to your hotel for secure storage while you're exploring Machu Picchu. Your guide will then take you from Aguas Calientes Railway Station up to Citadel of Machu Picchu by a 30-minute mini-bus transfer and give a briefing of how the morning's 1-2 hour guided walking tour will be conducted.

After exploring the most fascinating features of this astounding and mysterious Inca settlement, your tour concludes with buffet lunch at Sanctuary Lodge. The remaining afternoon is free for your own unguided exploration of Machu Picchu. Your return mini-bus transfer to Aguas Calientes is included; buses leave approximately every 15 minutes.

The village of Aguas Calientes is very small; on arrival please ask for directions to your hotel. Most properties are within a 5- 10 minute walk from the bus terminal. Your luggage will be made available to you after you have checked in. ***El Mapi by Inkaterra: 1 night superior deluxe rooms with dinner and breakfast***



TUE 26 SEP 2017 MACHU PICCHU/ CUZCO (B)

Return to Machu Picchu this morning to continue your unguided exploration of this extensive site; your return mini-bus tickets and entry to Machu Picchu are included. We recommend rising early and taking one of the first buses; the ruins are much quieter in the morning and seeing the mist clear as dawn breaks is a wonderful sight.



If you would like to climb Huayna Picchu you need to pre-book prior to departure from Australia. Although it is a challenging walk up, the views from Huayna Picchu are spectacular and we highly recommend this option for anyone with a reasonable level of fitness.

Later this afternoon, take a mini-bus back to the train station. We recommend leaving the ruins around 90 minutes prior to the departure of your train to allow enough time to collect your luggage from your hotel. On arrival, our representative will meet you and transfer you by road the rest of the way to your hotel in Cuzco, where the bulk of your luggage will be waiting. ***El Mercado Tunqui: 3 nights superior rooms with buffet breakfast***

WED 27 SEP 2017 CUZCO (B)

Discover one of South America's most beautiful cities on your half day guided tour of UNESCO Heritage Listed Cuzco. Your tour will show you the amazing colonial city built on the foundations of the Inca palaces. You will visit the Koricancha or Temple of the Sun, where you can appreciate the incredible masonry of the Incas.

Your next destination is the Main Square, upon which sit the Cathedral, the beautiful Church of La Compañía de Jesus (Society of Christ), and other Colonial period buildings. The adventure continues to the San Cristobal Church, located on top of a hill overlooking the city. What a view you will get! Afterwards, it's off to the Sacsayhuaman Fortress built of enormous stone blocks expertly shaped by the Incas. It is strategically located, also at the top of a hill that affords you an incredible panorama of the city. You will finish the tour visiting two other important archaeological sites: Qenko and Puca-Pucara.



THU 28 SEP 2017 CUZCO (B)

Day at leisure to relax and explore

FRI 29 SEP 2017 CUZCO/ PUNO (B/L)

You will be transferred to the train station this morning to board your Andean Explorer train service to Puno. This unique ten hour journey takes you through some of the most spectacular landscapes in South America; enjoy panoramic views of the Andean mountains, the high plateau dotted with llama and alpaca, and highland villages.



The luxury Andean Explorer is decorated in the great Pullman style of the 1920's and includes dining cars and a car-bar outdoor observatory. Your Andean Explorer train ticket includes: gourmet lunch, on board entertainment and afternoon tea.

Departing Cuzco the train travels along the Hutanay River, through green fields and remote communities. Crossing the valley we reach the Huambutio Vilcanota River, which plunges steeply into the gorge before widening to reach the Grand Canyon of the Urubamba. At Km 40 we reach Rumicolca, where the great stone doorway marked the entrance to Cuzco in Incan times. Shortly afterwards at Km 45 you'll see the Andahuaylillas church, one of the crown jewels of the colonial Cusco, with its magnificent murals and splendid paintings of religious themes.

Our journey continues through Rachi, San Pedro and Sichuan. You'll pass idyllic country scenes of terraced farms, green pastures and Aymara Indians bringing produce to local centres. In Marangi we start to leave the fertile hills of Cuzco for the great plateau known as the altiplano. The train continues its ascent to La Raya, the highest point of the journey at 4,321m and a cold and remote place.



We then begin our descent through the endless pastures and remote villages until reaching Juliaca, a bustling town of around 150,000 inhabitants, where you'll see countless merchants plying their wares along the tracks. From here it is a short ride to Puno, the end of our trip, from where you can see the sacred Lake Titicaca. On disembarkation you will be met and transferred to your hotel. ***Casa Andina Private Collection Puno: 1 night superior rooms with buffet breakfast***

SAT 30 SEP 2017 PUNO/ ISLA SUASI (B/L/D)

After breakfast we depart by speedboat for the remote island of Suasi, the only private island on Lake Titicaca. Visitors stop en route at the unique Uros Floating Islands and then enjoy a singular cultural experience visiting the traditional Alsuno community of weavers on Taquile Island, before venturing on to Suasi – arriving just in time for a barbecue lunch. Featuring panoramic lake views from every room, surrounded by terraced gardens and designed with native materials (stone, adobe and thatched roofs) to blend into the island, the lodge is committed to being green.

Suasi is a magical, and for many, mystical place to disconnect from the world. Spot rare vicuñas, hike to Itapilluni Hill to contemplate colorful high-altitude sunsets, paddle a canoe around the island, go on quiet nature walks, or visit the massage room and steam saunas with eucalyptus leaves. With 24 well-appointed but appealingly rustic rooms and the Andean Cottage (a spectacular two-bedroom lakefront suite), a candlelit gourmet restaurant, bar and game room, the lodge is the perfect place to relax after a day of doing plenty – or doing nothing at all. ***Casa Andina Private Collection Isla Suasi: 1 night superior rooms with full board***



SUN 01 OCT 2017 ISLA SUASI/ PUNO (B/L)

Enjoy the morning at leisure; at 13:30pm the speedboat leaves for Puno, arriving at the Casa Andina Private Collection Puno pier around 16:00pm. ***Casa Andina Private Collection Puno: 1 night superior rooms with buffet breakfast***

MON 02 OCT 2017 PUNO/ LA PAZ (B/L)

After breakfast we will depart by private vehicle for La Paz, Bolivia. We'll have a stop in Copacabana with a visit to the famous church and enjoy lunch in a local restaurant.

Continue by road to La Paz with drop off at the hotel this afternoon. ***Europa Hotel: 1 night standard rooms with buffet breakfast***

TUE 03 OCT 2017 LA PAZ/ SANTIAGO (B)

This morning you will be met at your hotel by a local representative for a half day tour of La Paz. This 4-hour guided tour of La Paz includes the area of the street markets; rich in handicrafts, weavings and witchcraft artefacts. The *Mercado de las Brujas* (Witches Market) on the Calle Linares is a highlight-wander the stalls crammed with strange and exotic potions, talismans and cures.

The tour also goes through the colonial part of the city; San Francisco Church, Gold Museum, Murillo Square and the outdoor replica of the Tiahuanaco temple.

Included in your tour is a ride in La Paz' brand new cable cars- a fantastic way to enjoy the views of this chaotic city and surrounding mountains. Operating at a height of 4000m above sea level, the cable car connects La Paz to neighbouring El Alto and is the highest cable car in the world. The cable car system consists of three lines, coloured red, yellow and green in line with Bolivia's flag. The system was constructed in just 2 years with the help of 1,200 full-time workers.



After the tour you will be transferred to the airport in El Alto for your flight to Santiago. On arrival you will be met and transferred to your hotel. ***Altiplanico Belles Artes: 2 nights classic double room with breakfast***

WED 04 OCT 2017 SANTIAGO (B)

Depart Santiago this morning, traveling through the Curacavi and Casablanca Valleys to arrive at the UNESCO World Heritage Listed port city of Valparaiso.



On arrival in Valparaiso we'll admire the colourful houses perched on the hillside and visit the highlights of the city: Victoria Plaza, Sotomayor Plaza and the Glorias Navales Monument. Your guide will take you through the winding streets and up the hillsides for lovely views of the port below. Later you'll continue to Viña Del Mar, known as the Garden City. You'll see the giant Reloj de Flores (Flower Watch), the art deco casino and the beach of Reñaca, where you will have time for lunch (not included). We return to Santiago via the coastal route, via Quinta Vergara Park, renowned for hosting the International Song Festival.





THU 05 OCT 2017 SANTIAGO/ CALAMA/ ALTO ATACAMA (B/D)

Transfer to the airport for your flight to Calama. On arrival in Calama you will be met by Alto Atacama hotel staff and transferred to San Pedro Atacama and your hotel.



Alto Atacama Desert Lodge & Spa is the only lodge in the San Pedro region that is totally enveloped by natural surroundings. Located in the lush Catarpe Valley of the Salt Mountain Range, just over a mile from the plaza of San Pedro, the Alto Atacama's design was influenced by local village architecture and conceived to blend seamlessly into its environment and appear as a part of the terracotta-colored ridge that rises behind it. The setting, the sweeping views, the tranquility and silence, and the hotel's wonderful outdoor lounge spaces make the Alto Atacama a destination unto itself, and unlike any other hotel property in the region.

Alto Atacama encourages guests to get off the beaten track, interact with the local indigenous culture and explore the desert's varied and eerily beautiful landscapes by foot or bike. More than half of Alto Atacama's staff is indigenous, and their personal stories and histories enrich a guests' understanding of the region. Geysers, hot springs, volcano climbs, mountain biking through desert canyons, horseback riding on a sand dune, and exploring ancient Incan ruins and petroglyphs are just a few of the 30 adventurous excursions offered, always led by highly trained local guides. Every evening, your guide will outline various options for the following day and help you design a program that best suits your time, interests and fitness level.

Exploration of this unique region is yours to enjoy.

SUN 08 OCT 2017 CALAMA/ SANTIAGO (B)

Transfer to the airport for your flight back to Santiago; on arrival please make your way across the road to your hotel. *Holiday Inn Airport: 1 night standard rooms with breakfast*

MON 09 OCT 2017 SANTIAGO/ PUNTA ARENAS (B)

Make your way back to the airport for your flight to Punta Arenas; on arrival you will be met and transferred to the hotel. Evening at leisure. *Cabo de Hornos: 1 night standard rooms with buffet breakfast*

TUE 10 OCT 2017 PUNTA ARENAS/ RIO GRANDE (B/L)

The journey begins early in the morning with a ferry crossing of the Strait of Magellan from the Punta Arenas waterfront to the town of Porvenir on the north shore of Tierra del Fuego. The ferry journey normally takes around two to four hours depending on the weather and sea conditions. Founded in the 1880s, Porvenir was settled by many Croatian immigrants and for a brief time was the hub of a local gold rush. Despite its small size, the Museo de Tierra del Fuego makes a worthwhile stop, with exhibits that range from 600-year-old Selk'nam mummies to the historian of Patagonian cinema.

From Porvenir we follow the coast road along the north shore of Useless Bay (Bahía Inútil), which received its unfortunate name from British sea captain Phillip Parker King who found "neither anchorage nor shelter, nor any other advantage for the navigator" while surveying the bay in the 1820s. King penguins have taken up residents along a tidal stream at the bay's eastern extreme, around a hundred birds protected within the confines of a small private reserve called the Parque Pingüino Rey. A well-marked trail leads down to the shore and blinds with views across the stream to the penguin nesting area. Nearby is the pioneer cemetery for the historic Estancia Caleta Josefina, a windswept graveyard that shelters the remains of Scottish settlers including several "killed by indians."

Twenty miles (29 km) farther east is the San Sebastian border crossing, where travelers pass through Chilean and Argentine frontier posts. The cross-island highway soon reaches the South Atlantic and a smooth run down the coast to Rio Grande. Overnight at a Río Grande hotel or estancia. If dinner is not included in your hotel stay, try to feast on a genuine Argentine steak and Quilmes stout at the Posada de los Sauces restaurant and bar near the Rio Grande waterfront. *Rio Grande Hotel (or estancia): 1 night standard rooms with breakfast*

WED 11 OCT 2017 RIO GRANDE/ USHUAIA/ STELLA AUSTRALIS (B/L/D)

We start the day with a gaucho experience and Patagonian-style "asado" barbecue at the 80-year-old Estancia Las Hijas, located about 50 miles (80 km) south of Rio Grande. Back on the road, the highway leaves the pampas behind for a landscape of Magellanic forest with snow-capped mountains in the distance. Herds of guanaco graze meadows on either side of the road. A brief stop in the hilltop town of

Tolhuin affords views of Lake Fagnano, the island's largest freshwater body. There's time to munch pastries at the legendary Panadería La Unión before hitting the road again. Cutting through the southernmost part the Andes, we arrival at Ushuaia for check-in, boarding the Stella Australis for departure.

The Stella Australis was constructed in 2010 and has capacity for 210 guests across 100 cabins and 5 decks. The awe-inspiring vessel contains a dining room, three separate lounge areas and gym.

Included in your cruise package:

- Breakfast, lunch and dinner
- Open Bar (while staff are on duty)
- Daily land excursions as scheduled by the ships
- Whisky and hot chocolate during the excursions
- All on board activities

Boarding commences at 5:30pm; after a welcome cocktail reception given by the Captain and his crew we will depart. Our trip takes us through the Strait of Magellan and Beagle Channel to explore one of the most breathtaking wilderness regions in the world: Southern Patagonia and Tierra del Fuego.

Stella Australis: 3 nights A category cabins- all inclusive



THU 12 OCT 2017 STELLA AUSTRALIS (B/L/D)

By early morning, Stella Australis is cruising across Nassau Bay into the remote archipelago that includes Cape Horn National Park. Weather and sea conditions permitting, we shall go ashore on the windswept island that harbors legendary Cape Horn (Cabo de Hornos). Discovered in 1616 by a Dutch maritime expedition -- and named after the town of Hoorn in West Friesland -- Cape Horn is a sheer 425-meter (1,394-foot) high rocky promontory overlooking the turbulent waters of the Drake Passage. For many years it was the only navigation route between the Pacific and Atlantic, and was often referred to as the "End of the Earth." The park was declared a World Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO in 2005. The Chilean navy maintains a permanent lighthouse on the island, staffed by a lightkeeper and his family, as well as the tiny Stella Maris Chapel and modern Cape Horn Monument.

Sailing back across Nassau Bay, we anchor at fabled Wulaia Bay, one of the few places in the archipelago where the human history is just as compelling as the natural environment. Originally the site of one of the region's largest Yámana aboriginal settlements, the bay was described by Charles Darwin and sketched by Captain FitzRoy in the 1830s during their voyages on the HMS Beagle. This area is also renowned for its mesmerizing beauty and dramatic geography. After a visit to the Australis-sponsored museum in the old radio station -- which is especially strong on the Yámana people and European missionaries in the area -- passengers have a choice of three hikes (of increasing degrees of difficulty) that ascend the heavily wooded mountain behind the bay. On all of these you will be strolling through an enchanted Magellan forest of lengas, coigües, canelos, ferns, and other endemic fauna to reach a panoramic viewpoint overlooking the bay.

**FRI 13 OCT 2017 STELLA AUSTRALIS (B/L/D)**

After nightfall we re-enter the Beagle Channel and sail westward along the southern edge of Tierra del Fuego into a watery wonderland protected within the confines of Alberto de Agostini National Park. Part of the channel is called Glacier Alley and on full moon nights you can often see several of the seven major glaciers that give the passage its name. Rounding the Brecknock Peninsula as the western extreme of Tierra del Fuego, Stella Australis is for a brief time exposed to the open Pacific. We then navigate a zigzag route through the Cockburn Channel, Magdalena Channel and Keats Fjord to reach scenic De Agostini Sound.

Named after an Italian Salesian priest who worked among the region's indigenous people during the first half of the 20th century, De Agostini Sound is flanked by numerous glaciers and sheer saw-toothed peaks reminiscent of Torres del Paine. Our shore excursion this morning is Águila ("Eagle") Glacier, which hovers above a placid glacial lagoon surrounded by primeval forest. After a Zodiac landing on the beach, passengers hike around the edge of the lagoon to a spot near the base of the frozen facade. Condors can sometimes be seen winging high above, but there is always abundant bird life around the lagoon. This landing provides the perfect opportunity to experience the beauty of Patagonia's sub-Antarctic rainforest and to see how the power of nature has moulded the spectacular landscape.

SAT 14 OCT 2017 DISEMBARK PUNTA ARENAS/ SANTIAGO

After an overnight cruise back into the Strait of Magellan, we anchor off Magdalena Island, which lies about halfway between Tierra del Fuego and the Chilean mainland. Crowned by a distinctive lighthouse, the island used to be an essential source of supplies for navigators and explorers and is inhabited by an immense colony of Magellanic penguins.

At the break of dawn, weather permitting, we go ashore and hike a path that leads through thousands of penguins to a small museum lodged inside the vintage 1902 lighthouse. Many other bird species are also found on the island. After a short sail south along the strait, disembarkation at Punta Arenas is scheduled for around 11:30 AM.

We transfer to Punta Arenas airport for your flight to Santiago. *Overnight at the Holiday Inn Santiago Airport*
